NEW CAMPUS DEDICATED AT OPEN HOUSE

A new campus for Missouri Baptist College, St. Louis, was dedicated with a special ceremony and open house Sunday, September 22. More than 1,000 persons attended the afternoon activities which were under the direction of the Rev. Bual F. Bales, St. Charles, president of the board of trustees.

Dedication messages were given by Dr. L. A. Foster, president of Missouri Baptist College, and by Dr. Earl Harding, executive secretary of the Missouri Baptist Convention. A resume of the St. Louis campus development was given by the college vice-president, the Rev. Virgil L. Vaughn.

Presentation of the buildings was made by the Rev. O. A. Winscott, Rock Hill, chairman of the building committee; Mr. Walter Kromm, architect, and Mr. Andrew Nothum, the general contractor. Other platform guests included Dr. Robert Blackburn, assistant to the chancellor, Washington University; Mr. Robert Guy, administrator, Missouri Baptist Hospital; the Rev. Elmer Fiedler, moderator, St. Louis Baptist Association; and the Hon. Harold Diehlman, mayor, City of Creve Coeur.

Music for the afternoon was by the Church Choir, First Baptist Church, Ferguson, Mr. Bob Woods, director, and by Miss Sara Coday of Missouri Baptist College.

Entry of the buildings for the open house tour followed a ribbon-cutting ceremony directed by the Rev. Wallace E. Jones, Fee Fee. After the dedication prayer by the Rev. Frank B. Kellogg the eight ribbons across the doorway to the academic building were cut. These ribbons, symbolizing groups contributing to the development of the St. Louis Campus, were cut by Dr. Earl Harding, Jefferson City, Missouri Baptist Convention; Dr. Homer DeLozier, St. Louis, St. Louis Baptist Association; Rev. James Enoch, Festus, Jefferson Baptist Association; Rev. Robert Lawson, Union, Franklin County Baptist Association; Mr. T. H. Henry, Hannibal, trustee of the college; Dr. Rufus R. Crozier, St. Louis, Hannibal-La Grange College Extension Center; and Dr. Carl Goodson, faculty of the college.

Upon completion of the tour those present were guests at a reception given by the administration and the trustees.

BOOSTER BANQUET NOV. 12 AT ST. LOUIS

Second in a series of annual Booster Banquets but **first** on the new campus, the 1968 Booster Banquet has been set for Tuesday, November 12. Dr. Earl Harding, executive secretary of the Missouri Baptist Convention, is the featured speaker for this occasion.

Meeting at 7 p.m., the Banquet will be served in the new campus gymnasium. This will be the first large public gathering in this building since it was completed for use by the college.

Proceeds from the Booster Banquet will again be added to the Library Fund as was done last year. **New and additional books, as well as research equipment, are continuing needs for a growing college library.**

It is hoped that every church in the college area will make it possible for the pastor and his wife to represent the congregation at the Banquet and that other church leaders will accompany them. A church contribution of \$15 entitles the church to receive two tickets and additional tickets may then be rewarded for each \$5 contribution.

McNEIL SCHOLARSHIP FUND FIRST FOR ST. LOUIS CAMPUS

Mr. and Mrs. Delmer McNeil, members of Mary Ann Baptist Church, St. Louis, have established a student scholarship fund at Missouri Baptist College, St. Louis. The scholarship will be in the amount of \$200 each year and is to be administered by the college. This gift begins the funded scholarship program as it is the first gift designated for this purpose.

In recent years the McNeils have had an interest in helping college youth. Owner and manager of the McNeil Service, a custodial care service, Mr. McNeil employs several college students to operate his business. He also is a member of the college PIONEERS IN DEVELOPMENT.

The PIONEERS are helping to launch a new college program by assisting in meeting the critical needs of the operations budget. This is done through regular gifts at the rate of \$10 a month.

The McNeil scholarship will be awarded upon need and merit. The donors hope that this will help some Christian young man or young woman who would not be able to attend college without such assistance.

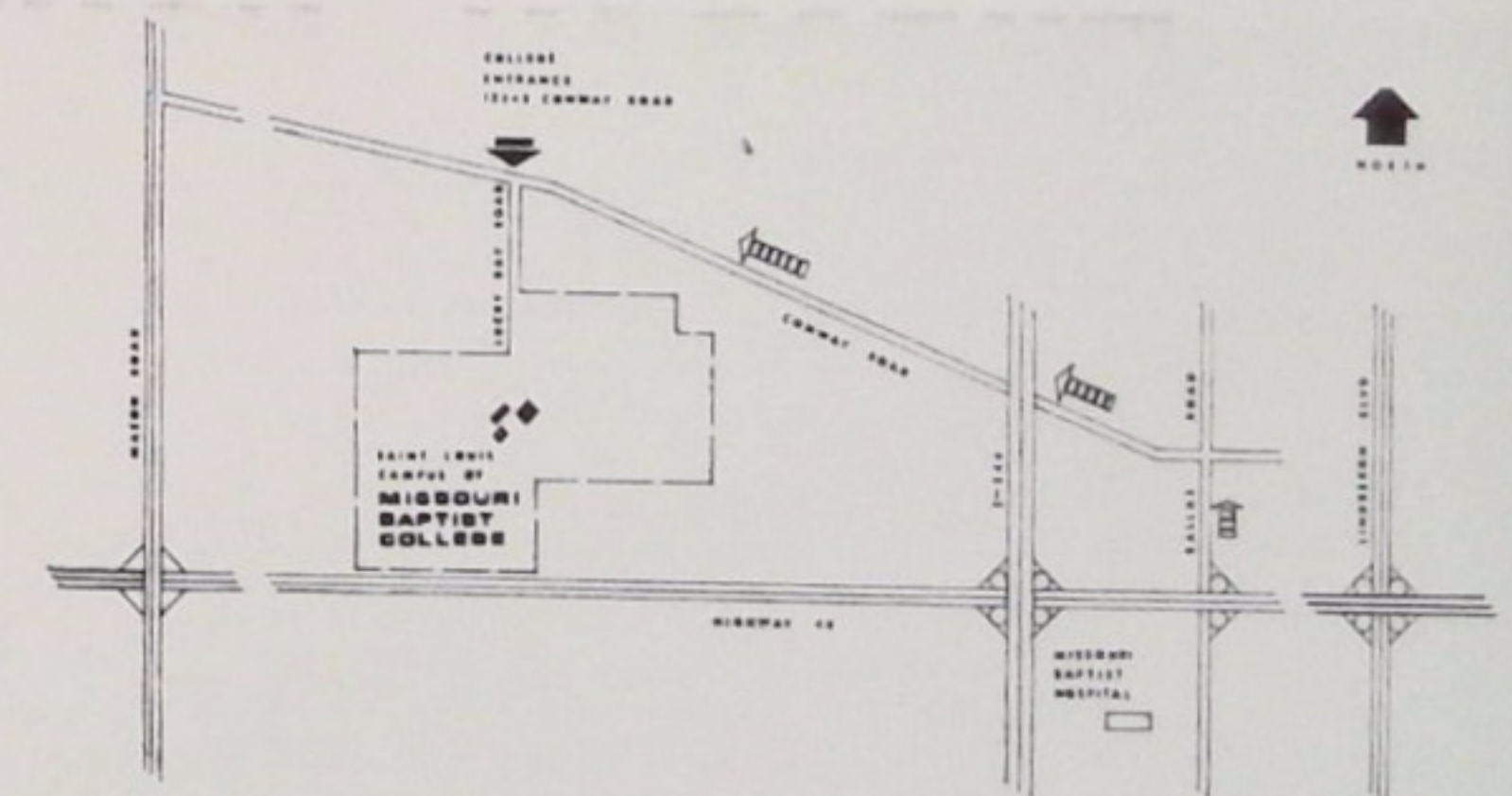

Faculty members for the pioneer year at St. Louis Campus have been giving their attention to class-room studies and organization of student activities. At the same time, several of the teachers have accepted responsibility for sponsoring student activities under the direction of the office of public relations and vice-president Virgil L. Vaughn.

Members of the 1968-69 faculty and their areas of instructions are Mr. Cedar C. Beel, biology; Miss Imo C. Brown, English; Miss Sara Coday, music; Dr. Rufus R. Crozier, history; Mr. Clyde C. Farris, Jr., sociology; Dr. Carl Goodson, religion; Mr. J. Carlton Gray, librarian; Dr. Herbert M. Haney, English; Mrs. Anabel R. Price, English; Mrs. Beatrice L. von Rohr, mathematics; Mr. Richard H. White, physical education.

Part-time instructors for this academic year include Mr. John B. Heald, French; Mr. James L. Redwine, psychology; Mr. William J. Skasick, Greek; Mr. William Spencer, psychology; Mr. E. Alan Wood, piano; and Mr. Jack Young, chemistry.

Evening classes are taught by members of the faculty on Tuesday and Thursday nights as part of the regular curriculum. These courses carry full academic credit.

The college feels fortunate to inaugurate its pioneer year with a well-qualified and experienced faculty. The past service of these teachers will enable them to offer good counsel in setting the pattern for a continuing college program of academic excellence.

PIONEERS IN DEVELOPMENT HELP FIRST YEAR'S OPERATION

Appeal for the unusual opportunity of helping to begin a new college program has caught the interest of several who are making special contributions to the St. Louis Campus as the initial PIONEERS IN DEVELOPMENT. ALL PIONEER gifts are used to supplement the operations budget.

PIONEERS IN DEVELOPMENT was instituted last June by the trustees with an invitation for participation in the PIONEER '68 program. The plan of the program is to enlist friends interested in Christian Education to help meet the costs of St. Louis Campus initial years operations with gifts at the rate of \$10 per month.

The PIONEER program is on an annual basis with open membership. Friends desiring to help may begin (or conclude) their membership at any time according to personal choice. PIONEER '68 will enrol members through December. PIONEER '69 enlistment will begin next January.

189 BLAZE THE ACADEMIC TRAIL

Establishing student policies and setting the pattern for a college tradition are parts of the unknown influence exercised by 189 pioneers—members of the initial classes enrolling at Missouri Baptist College, St. Louis.

Of the trail-blazing student body, 117 are classified as freshmen, 52 as sophomores and 20 as special students. Courses of study range from the 16-plus hour full-time student to the student attending one session of the evening classes and carrying 3 hours of credit work. Evening classes meet Tuesday and Thursday nights.

While the majority of the student body resides in the immediate St. Louis area, 20 are from "out-state" Missouri and 7 have residence in Illinois.

NEW HOPE CHURCH ST. LOUIS, EQUIPS OFFICE IN PASTOR'S HONOR

Announcement of a gift to the college to provide the cost of furniture for one of the faculty offices on the new campus has been made by the New Hope Baptist Church, St. Louis.

The gift is in honor of Dr. W. L. Muncy, a member of the Missouri Baptist College faculty. Dr. Muncy also serves as a part-time pastor of the New Hope church.

Plans for this tribute were revealed at special church services celebrating Dr. Muncy's completion of forty-nine years in the Baptist ministry (or as he states, "the beginning of the fiftieth year"). This service was held at the church Sunday, October 5, 1968.

A suitable recognition plaque will be prepared and placed in a faculty office to commemorate this gift. Faculty offices at the new campus are located on the second floor of the academic building. These provide a base of operation for the teachers and are conveniently accessible for faculty-student conferences.

The New Hope gift is appreciated for the honor it gives to this outstanding Baptist minister and teacher, for the assistance it provides to the college in the expense of equipping a new campus and for the service it will afford to many generations of college students.

CHRISTMAS BIBLE-LANDS TOUR SPONSORED BY DEAN GOODSON

A Christmas vacation and Bible-lands information tour will be conducted this year by Dr. Carl Goodson, dean at Missouri Baptist College, St. Louis Campus. The tour is scheduled for December 26, 1968 through January 4, 1969.

Members of the tour party will have the benefit of Dr. Goodson's experience in conducting previous tours as well as his twenty-two years background of Bible teaching. Cost of the tour is \$779.93 from St. Louis with return to St. Louis.
