## HISTORY AWARENESS MONTH

As we remember our inaugural theme "Spirit of Excellence", I would invite each of you to a special chapel on October 12th to celebrate history awareness month sponsored by the Historical Society of St. Louis County. The speaker will be former State Representative Francis (Bud) Barnes. A native St. Louisan, Mr. Barnes attended the University of Missouri-Columbia and Washington University Law School. Representative Barnes served in the U. S. Army during World War II, was Assistant City Counselor for St. Louis, City Attorney and corporate executive.

Today Representative Barnes is a trustee of the State Historical Society of Missouri, Director of the Historical Society of St. Louis County, Metropolitan St. Louis YMCA, and St. Louis Mercantile Library. He is a member of the First Presbyterian Church. He received the St. Louis Globe-Democrat Meritorious Service Award and was selected as one of the top ten Legislators from 1978 to 1983. Mr. Barnes' October 13th topic will be Citizenship.

In addition, a public proclamation signed by Buzz Westfall will be presented to R. Alton Lacey welcoming him to St. Louis. On October 13th, (yes it is Friday the 13th) the College will host the Annual Awards Dinner given by the Society in order to recognize outstanding local, regional and national

leaders. The following individuals will be receiving awards: Harry J. Cargas, Ph.D. - Edward Maguire Distinguished Teaching Award; James M. Duggan - Historical Society's Service Award; Lee M. Liberman - James M. O'Flynn Community Service Award Theodore Schafer - William Barnaby Faherty St. Louis History Award; The Honorable George "Buzz" Westfall - Henry Sutton Governmental Affairs Award; and John A. Wright, Ph.D. - St. Louis Book Award.

Certainly it is altogether fitting a young college intent upon welcoming its new leader could do nothing more appropriate than reemphasize its historical roots not only to Baptists but also to the Gateway to the West - namely St. Louis.

I would invite each of you to join us for both the Thursday Chapel and following evening's banquet. The cost for the later is \$14.50 and I will be pleased to "take your money". Come join in these events which I believe will be recorded as important in this inauguration year.
