Returning students may have already noticed some of the new faces in the faculty and staff of Missouri Baptist College. One of the new administrative officers that the college will be enjoying this school year is Jo Ann Miller, the new dean of students.

As Dean of Students, Mrs. Miller immediately involves herself in the college life of new students through orientation. Other duties include the maintenance of a complete calendar of school activities, the sponsorship of the Student Government Association, and the supervision of the residence hall.

Dean Miller is also president of the campus Alumni Association. She graduated from Missouri Baptist in 1979 with a Bachelor of Arts in English. Afterwards, Mrs. Miller went on to earn a Master's in English from UMSL. She is currently working towards her PhD in Education at St. Louis University.
